I am directed to state that the issue regarding certain anomalies arising from the implementation of revised pay scales and allowances consequent to the V CPC award has been considered in the light of the recommendations of a Committee specially constituted on the above subject and it has been decided that pending finalisation of the exercise undertaken by the Review Committee in the Ministry of Defence on Field Service Concessions, Armed Forces personnel posted for duty in the specified remote localities where field service concessions are presently not applicable but where civilian employees are entitled to a Special Compensatory (Remote Locality) Allowance will be granted SC(RA) Allowance at the same rates and subject to the same terms and conditions as are applicable to the Central Government civilian employees. However, if more than one compensatory allowance is admissible in any of these localities, the concerned personnel shall be entitled to receive the compensatory allowance whichever is the more beneficial to him.

Sir,

I am directed to state that the issues regarding certain anomalies arising from the implementation of revised pay scales and allowances consequent to Fifth CPC award for the Defence Service personnel has been considered by the Government in the light of the recommendations of a Committee specially constituted on the above subject and it has been decided that the deputation assignments of the Service Officers will continue to be rank based and the quantum of Deputation Allowance will be restricted to 50 per cent of the rates applicable to civilian officers as at present as notified by the Government vide Department of Personnel and Training O.M. No. 2/8/97(Pay II) dated 11th March, 1998 or the subject.

2. The restriction that pay plus Deputation Allowance should not exceed the maximum of the pay scales of the deputation may not be insisted upon when Service Officers are deputed to civilian posts. Instead, an overall ceiling of Rs. 22,400/- may be imposed on the aggregate of pay plus deputation allowance irrespective of the rank of the officer deputed and the pay scale of the post to which he is deputed.

3. There is no scope for inducting service personnel in Central Staffing Schemes.

I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letters No. 1(22)/97/D(Pay/Services) dated 8.1.1998 and to state that the issue regarding certain anomalies arising from the implementation of revised pay scales and allowances consequent to the V CPC award has been considered in the light of the recommendations of a Committee specially constituted on the above subject and it has been decided that the Technical Allowance to the technically qualified officers of the three services will be granted in two rates i.e. Tier-I Courses Rs. 1000/- per month and Tier-II Courses Rs. 1500/- per month.

2. The Technical Allowance at the rate applicable for Tier-I Courses will be admissible to all officers of the three services from the date they complete the prescribed professional technical training and are available for full deployment. While pre induction Professional Technical Training is prescribed in Navy and Air Force, so far as the Army is concerned such training course will be identified by the Ministry in consultation with Army Headquarters.

3. The Tier-II Courses for this purpose will be identified by this Ministry in consultation with Service HQs to ensure that such courses enable the officers to acquire specialisation on a particular weapon or system platform. Till such time a list of eligible Tier-II Courses is finalised, the Technical Allowance will be paid only at the rate applicable for Tier-I Courses.

4. Technical Allowance for the re-employed officers will be admissible only when they

are actually deployed on technical and maintenance duties and also fulfill the prescribed eligible conditions.

5. This Ministry's letters No. Air HQ/23956/100/PP&R-I/1376/D(Pay/Services) dated 14-4-82, No. PA/0262/NHQ/3295/D(Pay/Services) dated 9-8-84 and No. 30(10)SI/E (Pay/Services) dated 6-11-1984 are hereby superseded with immediate effect.

Sir,

The Fifth Pay Commission have recommended revision for the rates of Project Allowance admissible to Central Civilian employees. Ministry of Finance (Deptt of Expenditure) while revising the rates vide their OM No. 6/6/97/E-II(B) dated 01 Apr 1998 have desired that in regard to Armed Forces Personnel separate orders be issued by Ministry of Defence. The issue in this regard has remained under consideration of the Ministry. The President is pleased to decide that Services Officers deputed to a Project in an organisation, other than one under this Ministry, will be entitled to draw Project Allowance at par with Central Government employees posted in that project on the same terms and conditions as applicable to civilian from time to time. This will be subject to the further condition that they are not eligible for Field Service Concessions. The rates of Project Allowance will be as under :-

Basic Pay range (Revised)	Rates of Project Allowance per month in Rs.
Rs. 6000 p.m. to Rs. 8999 p.m.	600
Rs. 9000 p.m. and above	750

2. The terms 'Pay' for the purpose of Project Allowance shall be the pay drawn in the prescribed scale of pay, including Rank Pay, stagnation increment (s) and non-practising

allowance but shall not include any other type(s) of pay like special pay or personal pay, etc. In the case of those employees who opt to retain the existing scales of pay, it will include, in addition to pay in the pre-revised scale, dearness allowance and interim relief appropriate to that pay admissible under orders in existence on 1.1.1996.

3. Where the application of revised rates results in a monetary loss to an employee, who has been continuously drawing the allowance from a date prior to 1.8.1997, the amount drawn by him immediately prior to that date will be protected by treating the difference between the allowance so drawn and that admissible at the revised rates as personal to him. The protection will continue till the employee remains posted in the said project area and becomes eligible to higher amount either on promotion or otherwise.

4. These orders will take effect from 1.8.1997. For the period from 1.1.1996 to 31.7.1997, the above allowance will be drawn at the existing rates on the notional pay in the pre-revised scale.

I am directed to convey the sanction of the President to the grant of honorarium to Air Force & Army Officers and personnel, who were posted in Bhuj and had continued to work there even after the exceptional tragedy which took place as a result of earthquake in Bhujrat, on 26th January, 2001 for the dedicated work done by them in the exceptional circumstances. The amount of honorarium admissible shall be subject to a maximum given below :-

2. The admissibility of honorarium shall be subject to following criteria and fulfilment of the conditions given below :-

- (i) The period of calculation will be reckoned as the year commencing from 26th January, 2001 to 25 January, 2002.
- (ii) Whereas officers/personnel who remain posted in Bhuj for the entire year would be entitled to the full amount of honorarium, those who were posted to Bhuj for a lesser duration than this period, would be entitled to proportionate honorarium based on completed months of posted in Bhuj during the year 26th January, 2001 to 25th January 2002, on a pro rata basis.
- (iii) While computing the period of posting, the period of 14 days or less, over and above the completed months will be ignored and the period of 15 days and above will be counted as full month.
- (iv) The payment of honorarium shall be based on actual calculations for the entitled officers, which would be verified by the audit authorities before payment.
- (v) The honorarium shall be admissible only to those who were/are posted in Bhuj and involved in relief operations and not to those who had gone to give assistance. The payment of honorarium shall be subject to pre-audit.

2. The expenditure on honorarium would not exceed Rs.8.76 crores. The expenditure will be debited to Defence Estimates under the Major Head 2076, Minor Head 101 for the year 2001-2002.

Based on the recommendation of the 5th Pay Commission, Govt have announced certain modifications in the Central Civil services (Educational Assistance) orders, 1988 vide Department of Personnel & Training O.M.No.21017/1/97- Estt. (Allowances) dated 12-6-98. The President is now pleased to decide the following modifications will be made in the orders on the above subject applicable to Armed Forces Officers and personnel below officer rank :-

Subject : Recommendations for the Fifth Central Pay Commission – Decisions of Government relating to Grant of House Building Advance to Service Personnel.

Sir,

In supersession of this Ministry's letter No. 81853/AG/PS3(c)6376/D(Pay/Services) dated 24th December, 1985, I am directed to say that the President has been pleased to decide; that the Defence Personnel may be granted house building advance under the House Building Advance Rules promulgated by the Ministry of Urban Affairs and Employment as amended from time to time. After considering the recommendations of the Fifth Pay Commission and other relevant factors the President is pleased to liberalise further the existing scheme of House Building Advance, as per revised scales of pay as under:-

(a) **Cost Ceiling Limit.**

(i) The existing cost- ceiling limits viz 200 times of basic pay (inclusive of Rank Pay, if any) subject to a minimum of Rs.3 lakhs and maximum of Rs.8 lakhs is revised to 200 times of basic pay (Inclusive of Rank Pay, if any) subject to a minimum of Rs.7.5 lakhs and a maximum of Rs.18 lakhs.

(ii) Where the Head of Department is satisfied on the merits of the case, they may relax the cost-ceiling upto a maximum of 25% of the cost ceiling as mentioned above in individual cases.

(b) **Quantum of House Building Advance (HBA).**

(i) The existing maximum limit of House Building Advance viz 50 months basic pay (inclusive of Rank Pay, if any) subject to a maximum of Rs.70,000/- is revised to 50 months basic pay (inclusive of Rank Pay if any) subject to a maximum of Rs.2,10,000/- or cost of the house or repaying capacity whichever is least for new construction/ purchase of new house/flat.

(ii) The existing limit of 50 months basic pay inclusive of Rank Pay, if any subject to a maximum of Rs.60,000/- is revised to 50 months basic pay (inclusive of Rank Pay, if any) or Rs.1.80 lakhs for enlargement of existing house or cost of the enlargement or repaying capacity whichever is the least.

(c) For the rural areas, the existing conditions of the House Building advance being further restricted to 80% of the cost of construction/enlargement will remain unchanged.

2. The following categories of Defence personnel who are on regular engagement in the three Defence Services will be eligible for the grant of House Building Advance under these rules:-

Officers

(a) Permanent Regular Commissioned Officers

(b) SSRC, TC, EC and extended service Commissioned(Air Force) Officers who have rendered at least ten year continuous service provided that:-

(i) They do not hold a substantive civil appointment under the Central Government or a State Government and

(ii) The sanctioning authority is satisfied that they are likely to continue to serve at least till the house for which the advance is sanctioned is build and/ or mortgaged to the Government.

Personnel Below Officer Rank.

(a) Sepoys and above in the Army

(b) Seamen II and above in the Navy

(c) Aircraftmen and above in the Air Force and Non-Combatant (Enrolled) in the Air Force.

3. In their applications to the Defence Services personnel, the following expressions used in the said Rules will be deemed to have the meanings indicated against each:-

(a) **Rule 4(b)** : Pay including Rank Pay and Officiating Pay – in the case of Services Officers, this will mean pay of the rank including pay of the acting rank (except where the Acting Rank has been given on a purely short term basis e.g. in a leave vacancy or in the vacancy of the officer undergoing a course of instruction) and Personal Pay where admissible. In the case of JCOs and OR, it will include Rank/Appointment Pay, Good Service Pay and Increment of Pay.

(b) “CCS(CC&A) Rules 1965” referred to in Note (ii) below Rule 5(b) will be deemed to mean Army/Navy/Air Force Act and Rules.

(c) "Head of the Department" will mean Adjutant General/Chief of Logistics/Air Officer-in-Charge Administration , as the case may be. (The powers delegated to the Head of the Department may, however, be exercised on their behalf by officers of the appropriate status authorised by them).

4. **Rate of Interest.** Existing rate of interest on House Building Advance is modified as under:-

Amount of Advance	Rate of Interest
(a) Sanctioned advance upto Rs.50,000	7.5%
(b) Sanctioned advance upto Rs.1.50 lakhs	9%
(c) Sanctioned advance upto 2.10 lakhs	11 %

5. All other provisions like eligibility, repaying capacity, recovery etc. will remain unchanged.

6. The enhancement of house building advance in respect of past cases will, however, be dealt with as per the provisions of Govt. of India, Ministry of Urban Affairs and Employment QM No. I/17015/6/97/H. III dated 14 th January, 1988 as modified vide OM No. I/17015/6/97-H.III dated 23 March, 1998.

7. These orders will be effective from the date of issue of this Government letter.
