TRAPPED: The Round the World Expedition is stuck at Magadan in Russia for the fourth consecutive day

NEW DELHI: The Round the World Expedition is stuck at Magadan in Russia for the fourth consecutive day. According to reports reaching here, the microlight is currently running 12 days behind schedule.

The microlight could not take off on Sunday from Magadan due to inclement weather. The aircraft is completely dependent on the climatic conditions for its flight to the next destination Chaybukha, and its possibility of taking off on Monday looks very bleak.

On Friday, the microlight had to return to Magadan after having taken off for its next destination, due to blinding snow. The microlight, led by Wg Cdr Rahul Monga, had reached Magadan on Thursday.

On Tuesday, the microlight had reached Ajan. Incidentally, Wg Cdr Monga is the first Indian to have made it to remote Ajan.

The Russian leg of the expedition is right now being handled only by Wg Cdr Monga as Russian Air Traffic Control converses in Russian alone and it is therefore mandatory to have a Russian speaking navigator in the machine.

The other pilot, Wing Commander Anil Kumar will meet the expedition when it reaches Alaska.
