NEW DELHI: The IAF RTW trip in a microlight is still stuck in Anchorage, Alaska as low hanging clouds thwarted any attempts by the pilot duo of Wing Cdrs Rahul Monga and Anil Kumar to take off for their next leg.

With this, the duo's hope of recovering some of the lost days due to bad weather over Russia and China have been dashed to an extent.

They are, however, still confident that although completing the expedition in 64 days, as planned, is now out of the question, but a crack at the world record of 99 days is very much within reach.

The duo had taken off from the Hindan Air base near Delhi on June 1.
