NEW DELHI: The IAF RTW expedition is still in Canada as bad weather continues to haunt the duo of Wing Cdrs Rahul Monga and Anil Kumar.

These columns had wrongly reported Monday's location of the aircraft as Iqaluit. The duo landed in Iqaluit on Tuesday and had spent the last two days at a place called Wakeham Bay that was not on their itinerary.

The route change was necessitated by bad weather and the urgency to make progress.

The attempt to cross the Baffin Sea into Nuuk, Greenland will happen on Wednesday. Also, from now on, till the expedition reaches UK, the aircraft will have only Wing Cdr Monga.

Wing Cdr. Kumar will take a commercial flight and wait for the expedition to reach UK. This has been mandated by the need to carry
